Study of obesity and television viewing found a clear association between the number of hours a child watched television and the risk of that child becoming obese or overweight. In 12 to 17 year - olds, the prevalence of obesity increases by two percent for every hour of weekly television watching time. Eight. Percent of children watching one hour or less of television a day are obese 18% of children. watching four or more hours

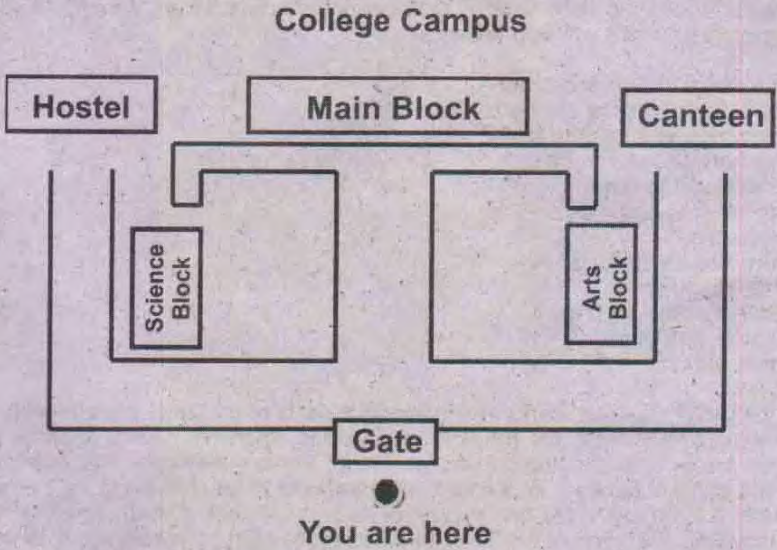

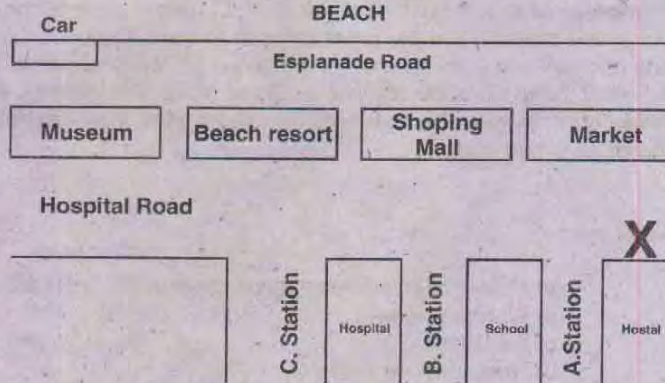
